## How a Motion is Made

- Recognition. Raise your hand to get the President's permission to speak:
   "Mr. (or Madam) President..."
- Make the motion. Offer your recommendation to the rest of the group: "I
  move we have a spring picnic..."
- It must be seconded. To support your idea, another member should say: "I second the motion..."
- Clearly state the motion. The President puts the motion in words that everyone can understand and then states the motion: "It has been moved and seconded that we have a spring picnic..."
- Discussion. The President invites members to discuss the motion: "Is there any discussion?"
- Restate the motion. The discussion ends when the President prepares the members for voting by restating the motion: "The motion before us is to have a spring picnic."
- Motion. The President calls for the vote. The vote can be done by voice, written ballot, or show of hands. If the vote is by voice, the President says:
   "All those in favor of a spring picnic, signify by saying, "aye"; those opposed, say "nay"; those abstaining?"
- State the results. The President announces whether or not the motion has carried or failed: "The motion carried."
