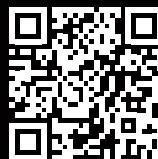




FIND HOME

Help for youth facing a crisis

GLCAP offers long-term and limited housing assistance for youth ages 18-24 who are experiencing homelessness, at risk of homelessness, or facing eviction.

SERVICE AREA:

Youth housing services are available in Crawford, Erie, Hancock, Hardin, Huron, Marion, Ottawa, Putnam, Richland, Sandusky, Seneca, Wood, and Wyandot counties.



SUPPORTIVE SERVICES:

Dedicated outreach workers can assist youth with needs such as housing search and relocation services, transportation, food and energy bill assistance, child care, housing application fees, referrals to other agencies for additional assistance, and other support.

YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD:

Opportunities are available for youth to be involved with the program's Youth Advisory Board, which assists with program design, marketing, implementing program improvements, and advocacy for youth housing assistance.

GUIDELINES:

Housing units must meet program requirements and the landlord must be willing to work with GLCAP. Participants may be asked to pay a portion of their income towards rent.



HUD Guidelines

U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) guidelines consider persons to be homeless if they are living in an emergency shelter, motel paid for by a charitable organization, tent or campground, or a place not meant to be lived in such as a car, park, or abandoned building.
